Why this research is important

- Autism is a developmental disorder with no cure.
- Pretend play is essential for later child development.
- Children with autism are impaired in pretend play.

What we know and what we don't know

- There is evidence that pretend play can be developed under prompted conditions.
- Technology can be used to prompt pretend play for children with autism.
- Not clear how prompts should be design and faded out to support pretend play for children with autism
